School Policy Update

The **Primary student use of mobile phones and personal devices policy** has been completed and ratified by Governing Council. This is in response to a government directive for all government schools in South Australia to have this policy developed and in place this term. As of next week, students will need to hand in to the front office any mobile phones, smart watches or digital devices at the beginning of the day and collect them from the front office at the end of the day.

The Australian Early Development Census (AEDC) Collection

This is an Australian Government Initiative and has been conducted nationally every three years since 2009. It is a national progress measure of early child development and involves teachers of children in their first year of full-time school completing questions in the Early Development Survey about each child.

Results from previous data collections have been used to help young children and families in a range of ways that can improve their development and wellbeing before they reach school, including schools using the data to collaborate with early years networks, communities identifying gaps in supports and services for families with young children and governments using the data as evidence to develop better policies for children.

UP Design and Technology

In Technology lessons we have been focusing on using the Engineering Design Process when working through design tasks.

It follows the following steps:

- 1) Ask – what is the task/problem I need to solve?
- 2) Imagine – what are some ways to solve the problem?
- 3) Plan – what are we going to do to solve the problem?
- 4) Create –build it!
- 5) Test – how well does it work?
- 6) Improve – what can we do to make it better?
- 7) Share – communicate your results

Their latest task was to design a rover to visit Mars. It needed to have features that would help it operate on Mars taking into consideration the extreme environment on Mars. It needed to include: solar panels, communication technology, dust protection, insulation, tough wheels (6), solar panels, a parachute for landing, a drone/helicopter and a device for collecting samples.
