## Term 2 Wellbeing Day—Whyalla



On Wednesday 26<sup>th</sup> Week 9 we held our Term 2 Wellbeing Day where we travelled to Whyalla for the day. We had perfect weather given the rain and cold we experienced the day before. The buses arrived at the Whyalla Maritime Museum, we disembarked from the bus and ate our recess in the Museum gardens. The kids split into two groups and then we began our activities – a self-guided tour of the Museum and a tour of the ship – HMAS Whyalla.

The Museum housed a range of different artefacts and memorabilia across several different galleries. The World War II Gallery documents the four small warships built in Whyalla - HMAS Whyalla, HMAS Pirie, HMAS Kalgoorlie & HMAS Gawler. The Museum also houses one of the largest model railways, with over 400m of track.

The HMAS Whyalla was the first ship built in the Shipyards in 1941. Our tour guide Maddie did a fantastic job, captivating the students' attention. We learnt how the ship has a flat bottom to prevent it from hitting things under water, but as a consequence the ship was subject to rocking back and forth up to 40°!! It was designed as a minesweeping vessel, locating and disarming mines before the larger ships passed through. The students enjoyed seeing how the men on the ship lived; where and how they worked all day, the tiny (cold) showers they shared, and the combined living, eating and sleeping area.

We ate lunch near the foreshore and the Ada Ryan Gardens. Then students were given the option to play on the playground or walk down to the new jetty. The impressive Circular Jetty is located along the Whyalla Foreshore, and is the only one of its kind in the Southern Hemisphere, first opened in 2020. Some were lucky enough to spot a dolphin or two, some jellyfish and the odd fish.

Staff and students proceeded back to the bus and arrived back to school just after the Bell. It was a fantastic day and great to see the students mixing together outside of school.

A special thanks to Miss Miller for driving the small bus, Miss Hollitt for being teacher in charge and all other staff and SSOs for their contribution on a successful day.
